Dear River Community Church Family and Friends,

Our hearts are amazing machines, beating over 100,000 times every day. In adults, the heart is only about the size of two hands clasped together, yet this small but mighty organ does its job of keeping our blood flowing without thought or help from us.

In the Bible, much attention is paid to our hearts. It's not so much the physical condition of our hearts that God speaks about but the spiritual condition. We read in Proverbs 4:23:

Guard your heart above all else, for it is the source of life.

Jesus taught about the fruit of the heart in the words recorded in Luke 6:

43 A good tree doesn't produce bad fruit; on the other hand, a bad tree doesn't produce good fruit. 44 For each tree is known by its own fruit. Figs aren't gathered from thornbushes, or grapes picked from a bramble bush. 45 A good man produces good out of the good storeroom of his heart. An evil man produces evil out of the evil storeroom, for his mouth speaks from the overflow of the heart.

And just as cardiologists are concerned about the effect of what we consume on the heath of our heart, so too is God. Take a look at Psalm 40:

8 I delight to do Your will, my God; Your Law is within my heart.

A steady diet of God's Word helps us to know and do God's will. The righteous, those who hear and do God's will, are described in Psalm 37 in this way:

30 The mouth of the righteous utters wisdom; his tongue speaks what is just. 31 The instruction of his God is in his heart; his steps do not falter.

Let the words of Psalm 119 be our testimony and our prayer as we consider our hearts this month:

10 I have sought You with all my heart; don't let me wander from Your commands. 11 I have treasured Your word in my heart so that I may not sin against You.

Grief & Guilt

Often in our grief we have to deal with the "woulda, coulda, shoulda" thoughts and feelings. Perhaps you have tried to share those feelings with others and they tell you "you shouldn't feel that way" or "why do you feel guilty, you did nothing wrong." Guilt is a feeling and we can't just stop feeling guilty because someone tells us to. We need to find out the cause of the guilt feeling and understand that feeling guilty is normal. The truth is we are human and live in a fallen world. Sometimes we make mistakes. Sometimes those mistakes are big and have serious consequences. Sometimes we make an err in judgment or make a mistake and it leads to someone's death. Sometimes it is something as small as not apologizing after an argument or not doing something we should have done. Sometimes in our grief we do not think clearly and we may feel guilty even when we have done nothing wrong. There are times we can feel guilty because without someone or something to blame we have to face the reality that sometimes life is unpredictable and out of our control. Maybe we don't even know why we are feeling guilty. This leads us to the big question, "What do we do?" Take it to God. Ask Him to show you what is causing your guilt. Guilt is not a feeling God wants us to carry.

" let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed with pure water." Hebrews 10:22

Ask God for forgiveness. No matter how big or how small our mistakes are, God is waiting for us to come to him and confess our mistakes (sin).

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

1 John 1:9

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7

May God guard and guide our hearts and minds and grant us His peace as we travel our journey of grief.

Breaking The Chains Biblical Recovery Ministry ~ Ken & Michelle Kavanagh



Recently the following statement came up in discussion,"This is the way I am!"

I mentioned that these are words spoken from a position of defeat. Once I had my say, Michelle continued on with the lesson. I then jotted down a note because I had planned on returning to this statement.

Freedom and victory will always stand out against any position of defeat. There are so many verses revealing freedom and victory "over" any defeat:

John 10: 10 The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly. (NKJV)

Now this scripture isn't about having more of this world, such as more money or more things that go bling. The verse reveals an element of why one may have a defeatist mindset. Mankind's enemy the devil, has come and is stealing/destroying in a way that has convinced many that they cannot overcome their problems or weather the storm that they are in. One can literally be brainwashed that they will never overcome a problem they may have.

However, in part b of that verse, is the solution. The solution is Christ Jesus. Again, Christ isn't coming to ensure people have monetary bling. He will provide all that is needed to renew the mind and live a life of freedom from overbearing burdens. Where one once was overcome in addiction, lusts, hurts, unforgiveness, etc... they can now KNOW that through Christ, He is the WAY of defeating those problems.

Romans 12:1And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him. 2 Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect. (NLT)

Ask yourself, "Is my life acceptable to my Savior?" "Is the way I am, the way Christ intends for me to be?"

Be honest with Christ. He immediately redeems the spirit of anyone who believes in Him and has repented of their sin(s). But the relationship with Christ does require obedience and one of the greatest "lies" (deceptions) of the devil is for one to believe, "This is the way I am." The devil's intent with this lie and mindset, is to keep one in a sinful disobedient life style.

Allow the renewing of the mind. Study God's Word and prayerfully find all that Christ offers to help one overcome problems that are keeping them in carnal sin. Know that Christ wants (desires) all persons to be free and walking in His victory over sin.

Romans 6:11 So you also should consider yourselves to be dead to the power of sin and alive to God through Christ Jesus.12 Do not let sin control the way you live; do not give in to sinful desires. 13 Do not let any part of your body become an instrument of evil to serve sin. Instead, give yourselves completely to God, for you were dead, but now you have new life. So use your whole body as an instrument to do what is right for the glory of God. 14 Sin is no longer your master, for you no longer live under the requirements of the law. Instead, you live under the freedom of God's grace. (NLT)

Recipe

I love this recipe SO MUCH that I want to share it with everyone I know! It's unusual, colorful, healthy, easy to make (yes, Dean, even you can do it!), and best of all delicious!

EGG ROLL IN A BOWL

1 Tbsp sesame oil

1 small red onion, diced

1 Tbsp minced garlic

1 Tbsp ginger, finely minced

1 lb ground pork

2 tsp Sriracha sauce

1 14 oz bag coleslaw mix

2 red bell peppers, sliced thin

1 10 oz bag matchstick cut carrots

3 Tbsp low sodium soy sauce or tamari

1 Tbsp rice wine vinegar

Salt & Pepper to taste

Heat sesame oil in a large (12"), deep skillet over medium heat.

Add red onion, cook 2-3 minutes

Add garlic & ginger, cook 1 minute until fragrant.

Add ground pork & sriracha, cook 7-10 minutes.

Add coleslaw mix, red bell pepper, carrots, soy sauce, rice vinegar, salt & pepper.

Cook, stirring occasionally until cabbage is tender, about 5 minutes.

Spoon into bowl & drizzle with your sauce of choice. Garnish with sliced scallions if desired.

I like Duck Sauce, but use whatever you like on your egg rolls.

Did you know you can keep fresh ginger root in a baggie in your freezer? Just take it out of the freezer a few minutes before using and cut off the needed amount. You don't really even have to peel it, especially if you will be grating it.
